Announcement of Faculty Position for Female Institute of Liberal Arts and Science, Kanazawa University

The Institute of Liberal Arts and Science, Kanazawa University invites applications for a tenured faculty position as associate professor or lecturer.

- 1. Open Position: One associate professor (Female), or lecturer (Female)
- 2. Affiliation: Faculty of Foreign Language Studies, Institute of Liberal Arts and Science
 - * Due to organizational restructuring, the successful applicant of this recruitment will be affiliated with Institute of Human and Social Sciences as of April 1, 2028, and will be expected to take responsibility for other subjects in both undergraduate major and graduate-level courses.

3. Main Duties:

- 1) Teaching Korean language courses in the liberal arts curriculum. (Minimum five to six 90-minute classes per week.)
- 2) Designing/Planning and coordinating Korean language classes in the liberal arts curriculum.
- 3) Planning and teaching Inter-cultural education courses (in-class courses, study abroad courses).
- 4) Conducting join research on foreign language education and on teaching material development for Korean language courses in the liberal arts curriculum.
- 5) Taking part in administrative work and institutional projects including acting as a class advisor for students at the School of General Education, and teaching introductory classes. (Approximately once in every three or four years)
- 6) Undertaking such other duties as designated by the head of the faculty

4. Academic Fields:

Korean language education, Culture of Korean-speaking regions, Korean linguistics or its related fields

5. Status of Employment: full-time, tenured

6. Qualifications:

- 1) Applicants should have a doctoral degree or expected to obtain a doctoral degree by the end of March, 2026.
- 2) Applicants should have teaching experience. (In addition to class teaching, experiences of participating in teacher-training courses, writing academic papers in Korean language education, or presenting at related conferences preferable).
- 3) Applicants should have an interest in and enthusiasm for study-abroad courses for students and ability to plan and conduct such courses as well as forming liaison with overseas universities.
- 4) Applicants should have sufficient proficiency in Japanese to communicate in daily business and take part in administrative work and institutional projects, including the work related to class advisor. (N1 of JLPT required if Japanese is not the applicant's first language)
- 5) Applicants should have abilities and willingness to take part in administrative works and institutional projects.
- 6) An ability to teach in English is preferable.
- 7) A successful candidate is required to reside in Kanazawa or in its surrounding vicinity, when employed.
- *Under Article 8 of the Equal Employment Opportunity Law (Special Provisions of Measures Pertaining to Women Workers), in order to actively improve our considerably low percentage of women researchers, applicants are limited to female researchers.

- 2) List of educational and research achievements (circle the item number for peer-reviewed papers), and details of any competitive research grants you have obtained (including the name of the funding organization; the research project title; total amount of money granted; year of grant receipt; your role in the research project, i.e., principal investigator or co-investigator). Please list books, articles, and book reviews and other shorter materials separately. Write the newest publication first followed by older items.
- 3) A copy of one major research achievement, such as a book, published paper, etc. and its summary/abstract
 - * Candidates may be asked to submit additional materials.
- 4) A copy of major educational achievement, such as a textbook, lesson slides, handouts)
- 5) An essay outlining your research interests and achievements, including future research plan at Kanazawa University (A4 1 page).
- 6) An essay on your experiences in education and future aspirations at Kanazawa University (A4 1 page).
- 7) The names, institutional affiliations, positions, and contact details (telephone numbers and e-mail addresses) of two personal references.
